A) Application:

Application is hereby made for Registration for use of the WWA Certification Trade Mark in respect to the following wine:

B) Applicant's Declarations:

(1) I/we hereby declare that

- (i) I/we will abide by the Regulations governing use of the Certification Trade Mark;
- (ii) I/we are a financial member of WWA;
- (iii) I/we are partially/fully (please delete that which does not apply) accredited members of an independently audited recognised sustainability programme provider approved by WWA viz.
- (iv) that my/our winemaking record keeping system consistently meets the standard required by NZFSA for grape wine export eligibility purposes or by an NZFSA-approved Wine Standards Management Plan Code of Practice.

(2) I/we hereby declare that in respect of the above wine:

- (i) the grape content is 100% from grapes grown on Waiheke Island and that this is able to be verified from my winemaking records, and
- (ii) the grape content is 100% from grapes grown either:
 - a) in accordance with the recognised sustainability programme offered by Sustainable Winegrowing New Zealand or any independently audited and recognised sustainability programme which may be approved by WWA from time to time, or
 - b) pending full accreditation to such a programme, subject to a Spray Plan and/or Spray Diary evidencing that sprays used and pre-harvest intervals for spraying adopted were in accordance with the NZ Winegrowers Export Wine Grape Spray Schedule

- (iii) the wine is included in my audited winemaking record keeping system which amongst other things, enables:
 - a) traceability i.e. that the grapes used to make this wine are able to be tracked from the vineyard or vineyards of origin through to the bottling of the wine, and
 - b) the accuracy of label statements to be determined.
- (iv) Export Eligibility has been obtained from NZFSA after sensory evaluation by the Wine Institute. The Export Eligibility number allocated by NZFSA is

C] Attachment:

- 3) Export Eligibility has not been obtained in respect of this wine and I therefore attach hereto a copy of a statement provided by an independent Sensory Evaluator approved by WWA evidencing that the wine is free from obvious fault as defined in Clause 3.6 of the New Zealand Grape Wine Export Code.

(The wine submitted for Sensory Evaluation was a bottled sample or tank sample from a homogenous batch of finished wine not subject to any further winemaking additions, adjustments or alterations before packaging.)

- 1) you are a member of the Waiheke Winegrowers' Assn. and

- 3) that the Sensory Evaluation Report include the statement in respect of each wine that "The wine has no obvious sensory faults associated with it i.e. it is not oxidised, malodorous or tainted by extraneous flavours".)

D] Verification:

- (4) I agree that WWA may at its sole discretion ask the Independent Auditor of my winemaking records (or such other auditor/verifier that we may agree upon) to verify any of the information or statements (including declarations) submitted in connection with this Application on the understanding that such verification or otherwise does not breach commercial confidentiality and that the Auditor's report to WWA will relate solely to the verification or otherwise of the information provided in this Application. I agree that costs incurred by any such inspections and/or audits shall be borne either by me or by WWA as the Committee of WWA shall determine.

[Note: Small winemakers who may be exempt from the requirement to register a WSMP under Regulation 5. (A) of the Wine Regulations 2006 (i.e. who make less than 10,000 litres of wine per year and who do not export any of the wine they do make) must still be able to satisfy the standards regarding sensory evaluation, traceability and sustainability noted above.]
